Mary died over a century ago, but her memory lingers in the hearts of humanity and her impact remains indelible. She exited the stage, leaving behind footprints of grace in the sand of time.

Although Mary's home was not the perfect example of what any child would admire. She did not allow the unfavourable situation of her home to deter her from fulfilling her purpose in life.

Due to the circumstances beyond her control, she had to attend school on a part-time basis to work as to support her family financially. At such tender age, she was able to maintain a balance between work, school, and church attendance.

She stopped her formal education at age 14 to begin working a 12-hour shift daily.

As a teenager, Mary joined a local mission in Dundee, to take the gospel to a poor community. She would encourage mobilize youths to Sunday school meetings. At the age of 28, Mary left the shores of Scotland for Calabar, Nigeria, following her missionary training.

The Beautiful Jewel

The Bible uses several similes to describe God's people. One of such symbolic names is a Jewel. In Malachi 3:17, God referred to His people as Jewels. What does it mean, and why did God use this expression? Jewels are ordinary raw materials converted into precious ornaments.

The craftsman picks up a stone, exposes it to heat and pressure for a long time. In the end, a valuable gemstone evolves. In the same way, God wants all His people to be admirable and beautiful to behold.



To be God's jewel, you must allow God to take you through the process of conversion and refinement. Are you willing to let God chip off certain excesses, habits, or tendencies out of your life as He feels necessary?

If you desire to be among God's Jewels, then you must be willing to sincerely ask him to chip and polish your life as the craftsman does to the stone. Moreover, you must be patient with God while He works on your life.

Several people want a positive change in their situation today, but they are not ready to submit to God's word. Unfortunately, God's word is the primary tool He uses to save, transform, and beautify the lives of His people (Romans 1:16).
